

# FITZMAURICE SCHOOL, BRADFORD-ON-AVON, WILTSHIRE



Classroom Extension


The original school building was built in 1926 using traditional materials namely Bath stone and clay plain tiles and has since had numerous extensions and additions. Before this project commenced the internal spaces did not comply with current educational specifications. The Classroom areas ranged from as little as 38m<sup>2</sup> to a very large 74m<sup>2</sup>.

The first phase of this project was to modernise and refurbish the inside of the School buildings. This included changing the main entrance to a more suitable location within the building and forming a Reception Area and Offices from an existing Classroom and Toilets. The remaining Classrooms had walls removed and rebuilt to create spaces of a more uniform size that are now acoustically separated from each other. Soon after the design stage had begun, the Client requested further works at the school. The additional works included extensions to provide two new Classrooms, Staff room, and Toilets.

Both phase one and two have now been completed and the School are very pleased with their new and refurbished facilities.
